We know that we have many very capable women across Canada who could contribute much to our association. Please do not “sell yourself short” before giving the matter serious thought. Being part of the National Executive brings many rewards. To mention a few, it is, of course, a great learning experience; you meet and make many new friends; and you gain confidence, an inner sense of satisfaction and accomplishment because you are serving your church and your community which we are called upon to do. We must honor our predecessors by continuing the work we have been doing for the past eighty-five years.

Heroines and heroes are not only in books and movies, there are many hundreds or even thousands of every-day heroines and heroes among us. In my mind, our Ukrainian pioneers, and those who came after them are among these every-day heroines and heroes. They carved out a life for themselves and their children here in a new land, leaving us the richest legacy – our precious lifesaving Orthodox faith, and our unique and beautiful Ukrainian culture. They secured for us a significant place within this Canadian society. We owe them a great debt. If they had been as complacent, and even negligent, as we, who are their successors, have become, we would have no knowledge about who we are, nor where we came from. By this point in time, we would be totally assimilated and lost within this country. Let us keep them and this legacy they gave us in our hearts, let us not fail them. Let us follow in their footsteps, continuing to maintain and pass on this precious gift they gave us.

### **ANNIVERSARIES**

The year 2011 is a significant year for the Ukrainian Women’s Association. This year we recognize the 85<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our Association, and the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of our own Ukrainian Museum of Canada. These anniversaries will be recognized at the USRL Convention in Edmonton.

We ask each branch to plan a special function within their parish to recognize these important milestones. Perhaps a fund-raising function for the museum would be something you want to do. For the past two years donations to the museum from both the UWAC branches and UWAC members have dropped significantly. For those of you new to our Association or those not familiar with this, at the National Convention six years ago, each component organization of the USRL made a pledge to donate a certain amount of money yearly to the museum. Our UWAC pledge is \$20,000. For two years now the pledge has not been met by donations, therefore, we have had to make up the shortfall from our National office funds, which in turn is depleting our operating budget.

I realize that asking for funds is not the most popular, or desirable, thing one can do, but, unfortunately, we must face reality, “bite the bullet”, and do what needs to be done. I thank you all for your patience and consideration.

## **CANADIAN MUSEUM OF HUMAN RIGHTS**

The Ukrainian Canadian Congress has been keeping us informed of the developments regarding this Canadian Museum of Human Rights - CMHR, which is to be built in Winnipeg. In 2003, the promises made to the Ukrainian Canadian community by the Asper Foundation stated that the Holodomor and the Internment of Canadians would have a permanent and prominent space in this museum, which is to be publicly funded.

However, in the final report of the Content Advisory Committee, we see that those pledges have not been honored. The Chief Operating Officer of the CMHR recently stated that only the suffering of the Jews and the Canadian Indigenous peoples will have permanent and prominent assigned gallery spaces. A hundred, or so, other genocides or crimes against humanity would be put together into a "Mass Atrocities" zone.

We should not accept this – in a museum that is tax-payer funded all peoples should be fairly and equitably represented. Is it right to make the suffering of one group of people more significant than another?

The UCC has called on all Ukrainians to take action by writing their Members of Parliament of their displeasure, and by signing the petition which has been circulated. Very recently the UCC sent out packages of postcards to sign and send to your MP. If you received this package of postcards in your community, please take the time to pass them to all members of your branch and parish. We must take action and stand united in this matter so that the genocides suffered by our people are not slighted.

## **BRANCH CLOSURES**

Unfortunately, each year we lose a branch or more due to a large decrease in membership. The procedure for the disbanding of a branch is outlined in the Constitution. Please send a letter to our office of your intent before you disband completely.

If at all possible, I would encourage branches to try amalgamation with a sister branch before complete disbanding. It can be made to work if the distance is not great.

If your branch has become disbanded, each of the members can pay a direct membership to our National Office. That way your years of service would still continue. You would receive our Newsletter so that you can stay informed and be a part of what we do. You could actively participate in our conventions, and you would still be contributing to our Association and the work that we carry out.

## **VISNYK ARTICLES**

I take this opportunity to invite everyone to read the articles I have been sending in for printing in Visnyk. As I stated in the first article, I have had a significant number of questions about the Ukrainian Self-Reliance League - USRL, or CYC by its Ukrainian acronym, namely, the structure of CYC, and the relationship of the CYC component organizations with the Ukrainian Orthodox Church. It seems that some of our people, more significantly the younger generations, are not quite familiar with our organizations and how they fall in with our Church.

This prompted me to outline, briefly, the beginnings of our people in Canada, and the development and growth of our Ukrainian Orthodox Church and our Organizations. I felt that every Orthodox member should know, and be familiar with, our history in Canada in order to help promote better understanding of each other, how we work together with the Church. My goal is also to dispel the misconceptions that do occur, and to promote unity and harmony among our members.
